ENGLISH

- Rapunzel- looking at settings ad characters.
- Writing our own Rapunzel stories with different main characters and their methods of escape.
- Writing instructions to make a jam sandwich for the giant- bossy verbs.
- Traditional rhymes- London Bridge- making our own version based on the witch's tower.

GEOGRAPHY

- Similarities and differences in locations (physical and human.) Tocuare (Mexico) and Thornton.
- Analysing the local area of Thornton and the different amenities on a map.
- Ask simple geographical, 'where?', 'what?', and 'who?' questions about the world and their environment e.g. 'What is it like to live in this place?'
- Investigate through observation and description.
- Recognise differences between their own and others' lives.

MATHS

- Number and place value- counting, identifying 1 more or less, writing numbers as words.
- Measurement- compare mass/weight, measure and record weight.
- Shape- Recognise and name 2D and 3D shapes.
- Money- count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s, recognise and know coins and notes.
- Multiplication- Add one and two digit numbers to 20, recall doubles and halves.
- Division- Subtract one and two digit numbers to 20, recall doubles and halves.

- Online safety why do we need to stay safe?
- What information should we keep private.
- Why and how do we use passwords.

RE/PSHE

- Hinduism- what do Hindus believe about God.
- Hindu festivals
- How to keep safe- who should we trust? How can we look after ourselves? How can the emergency services help?

- Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.
