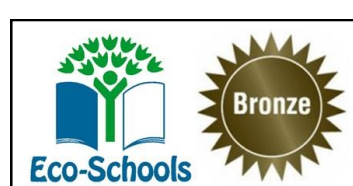


Please Contact the Office

My Half Term Challenge

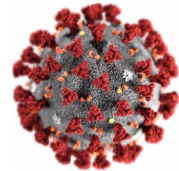
Here's a challenge for you over the half term.

Covid-19 Reminder



I have to say, you probably don't want to read this again, but I ask that you do just to remind yourselves.

First and foremost, thank you to the parents who have worked so hard with us over the last year, supporting us and helping to keep us all safe - we cannot thank you enough.

Please be reminded that if your child is ill in any way, we will not accept them into school in a morning. Please do not bring them if they have a high temperature, a cough, a loss of smell or taste, a headache or if they feel sick, have vomited or have had diarrhoea. There are many other illness where children should not attend school, but the list is too extensive to include here.

If your child is ill in school, we will contact you. In this instance, we will either ask for your opinion or request that you come to collect your child. We would appreciate it if you would come as soon as possible, in order for us to be able to protect the rest of our school community.

Your child should not attend school at all if any of the family are going for or awaiting a COVID-19 test result. If you are having a test, this means that you suspect you may have the virus and therefore your whole family should be isolating until a **NEGATIVE TEST HAS BEEN RETURNED TO YOU**. Sending your child in at a time like this, increases the risk to the whole school community, which is what we desperately want to avoid.

I need to also add here that many members of staff are concerned about parents in the playground, Although parents are wearing masks, many are not keeping their distance from each other. May I ask that you observe this request when we return to school on Monday 22nd February 2021.

If your child tests positive over the holiday, you must follow the instructions given below :-

If your child shows symptoms of Covid-19 within 48 hours of the end of the school term, or tests positive for Covid-19 having shown symptoms within 48 hours of the end of school term, you should report this to school immediately by emailing :-

Staff will be on hand at certain times of the day to notify any other pupils in your child's bubble and their families so they can self-isolate for ten days. It's vital you tell us immediately about any positive test results so we can help prevent the spread of coronavirus in our community. Many thanks for your support with this.
