Vocabulary	
Victorian	The time of Queen Victoria's reign.
20 <sup>th</sup> Century	The 20 <sup>th</sup> century was 1900-1999.
21 <sup>st</sup> Century	We are in the 21 <sup>st</sup> century. It started in 2000 and will end in 2099.
Wooden toys	Lots of toys were made of wood such as balls and trains. Some toys are still made of wood.
Paper toys	Some toys, like paper windmills were made out of paper.
Metal toys	Toy soldiers and some spinning tops were made out of metal.
Plastic toys	Most modern toys are made out of plastic.
