**Vocabulary**

Sources	Things or objects we use to find out about history.
Steam train	A train powered by steam which used to run through Thornton Station.
Village	A small group of houses. Smaller than a town.
Windmill	A building with sails or vanes that turn in the wind and generate power to grind corn into flour.
Chronology	The arrangement of dates or events in the order which they happen.
Horse and Cart	A basic means of travel which people used to use.
18 <sup>th</sup> century	The century in which the school was built.
