


What should I already know?

Vocabulary

Antananarivo	the capital city of Madagascar
Africa	the world's second largest continent
beach	a landform along the coast of an ocean, sea, lake, or river that usually consists of loose particles, such as sand, gravel, shingle, or pebbles
capital city	city from where the government of a country functions
chameleon	a type of lizard that can change the colour of its skin
climate	general weather conditions of a region
coast	the land next to the sea
continent	is one of several large landmasses
country	an area of land that has its own government, army, etc.
endangered	any type of plant or animal that is in danger of disappearing forever
equator	an imaginary line that is drawn around the middle of the Earth to divide it into the Northern and Southern Hemispheres
fossa	a mammal in Madagascar that is related to the mongoose
hills	a naturally raised area of land, not as high or craggy as a mountain
island	an area of land that is surrounded by water
landscape	a large area of countryside, especially in relation to its appearance
lemur	mammals known for their large eyes and monkey like bodies
National park	a park or an area of land officially protected by a nation's government
Malagasy	People from Madagascar/the language spoken in Madagascar
mountain	a landform that rises high above its surroundings and is taller than a hill
ocean	a huge body of salt water
plain	a broad area of relatively flat land
rainforest	are forests with tall trees, warm climates, and lots of rain
river	a flowing, moving stream of water
temperature	how hot or cold something is
tropical	very hot and humid
