Uniform

Free School Meals

This information has been taken directly from the Government website. It is really important to us that you read this very carefully, as not only may your child be eligible for a free school meal, but school may also be eligible for money to help support your child in school.

It is important to state here, that no other child in school is aware of children on free school meals.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

Your child may also get free school meals if you get any of these benefits and your child is both:

- Younger than the compulsory age for starting school or
- In full time education

Infant free school meals in England

Your child will be able to get free school meals if they're in a government-funded school and in:

- Reception class
- Year 1
- Year 2

However, please do apply for this funding if you are eligible from the statements above, even if your child is in Reception or Key Stage 1, as the school can get extra funding if you do.
