North West Childhood Immunisation Campaign

This week Lancashire County Council Health Protection Team are delighted to launch UKHSA's new national marketing campaign, promoting the critical importance of childhood vaccination.

The campaign is in response to falling vaccine uptake rates, which have led to the recent measles outbreaks in England, and in line with our strategic priority to improve health outcomes through vaccines .

Advertising across the country aims to capture the attention of parents and carers and encourage them to act now, if their children have missed any of these crucial vaccines, with a particular focus on MMR. Advertising activity includes a video advert on streaming and on demand services, radio advertising, digital display, online and on social media.

The video features the faces and voices of young children, speaking directly to camera about the very real and present danger of childhood diseases, and aims to capture the viewer's attention and make a compelling case for action. The campaign is aligned to a national NHS-led call and recall programme for the MMR vaccine. We hope that the focused marketing and communications drive, combined with enhanced NHS activity, will help start to address falling vaccine uptake.

The campaign was developed in partnership with NHS North West, NHS Greater Manchester, Liverpool City Council and DHSC and tested with families across the Northwest region.

Key Stage 1 Children

It has been brought to my attention that a few parents are allowing their Key Stage 1 children to come into the playground on their own in a morning. I know it can be difficult when you are in a rush, but we would prefer it if you would bring your child to the classroom door so that everyone knows they are safe. Added to this is the fact that some parents are requesting that staff send children out of the school gates on their own to meet you

on the pavement at the end of the day. We will not be allowing this anymore as we need to ensure that children are safe when they leave our school gates and we are unable to guarantee this if they are leaving the grounds on their own. We really do not want an accident when a child decides to run out into the road. Therefore, as from Monday, the Key Stage 1 staff will be keeping the children with them at the door until you have entered the playground to ensure safety for all.
